COATS FOR KIDS

HOW YOU CAN SERVE: Collect new or used coats and drop them off at our Traders Point Northwest, North, or Downtown campuses on Sunday, October 4, from 8am-5pm, and at the West campus from 8am-12pm.

Children from across Central Indiana need coats to stay warm this winter. While a winter coat may seem like a small gift, the Coats for Kids program makes a big impact on local families who are struggling to put food on the table and keep the heat on through winter. Coats can be used or new. Coats are provided for children ages newborn to 17, but the most needed sizes are generally 8-10 (medium/large kids).

We're going over the edge! Our student ministry is partnering with Central Indiana Youth for Christ (CIYFC) in their annual "Over the Edge" event. The goal is to help curb the rising tide of youth violence by helping raise critical funds that will help teenagers across our city participate in CIYFC's programs. The number of violent crimes among teens has increased in Marion County, and the recidivism rate is disproportionately high at nearly 80%. We're raising money to support CIYFC's Juvenile Justice Ministry, and for every \$1,000 raised, one of our TP Students staff will go over the edge of the Barnes & Thornburg building in downtown Indianapolis.

FOOD ITEMS

- Canned meats (tuna & chicken)
- Canned vegetables/fruits
- Canned stews/soups
- Applesauce
- Cereal
- Cooking oil
- Creamy peanut butter
- Hamburger Helper (or similar boxed meals)
- Healthy snacks (granola bars, crackers)
- Kid-friendly foods (ravioli, SpaghettiOs)
- Jelly (plastic jars only)
- Juice boxes
- Pasta (non-perishable)
- Saltine crackers
- Spaghetti sauce (plastic jars only)
